We have been through an experience that most facilities never have to go through, but we are settled into our "new normal" and are back to our day-to-day operations here. A huge THANK YOU to the many volunteers, employees, and citizens of Ashley who stepped up in our time of need and assisted us to get all of the residents safely evacuated and to their temporary locations. It shows what an amazing community we have here in Ashley and how selfless everyone becomes in a crisis. The residents have all said how happy they are to be home and how glad they are that thing turned out as well as they did. During that crazy week we also were visited by the State Health Department for our annual survey (just our luck right?)! We had a great team of surveyors who were easy to work with and had one of the most successful surveys we've had in recent years! We received only four deficiencies which were all minor and easy to address and fix. If you would like to see the results of the survey and deficiencies addressed you can find them posted at the nurse's station. A big "hats off" to the AMC staff for all of the hard work they do day-in and day-out which made our survey a success! There are a couple bits of business that need to be addressed for this edition of our newsletter. We have recently audited the personal belongings of each resident to ensure that all residents have what they need. We have noticed that many of our female residents are in need of their own electric razors or facial hair trimmers. These can be found almost anywhere, Wal-Mart, Target or Amazon and are very affordable. If your loved one is in need of one of these items we will let you know so these can be purchased. As always, we appreciate those of you who are so willing to help make sure that the residents have what they need and are not going without anything! Also, with the New Year came changes to many resident insurance plans. If you have received a new insurance card or prescription drug card for your loved one in the SNF please send or bring a copy of that information to staff so that we can update the resident's chart and insurance information for billing purposes. We also are looking out for the newly-updated Social Security cards for our residents as well. We have received some, but many have not yet. This

may take until April for all new cards to be issued, but if you received a new one, please inform the staff so we may update the chart. If you have any questions or concerns related to Social Services please let us know so we can address them as they come up! Thank you for all you do and here's to hoping that winter leaves us soon! 
